This week, Year 2 have been busy learning how to write a recount. They have enjoyed starting to think about multiplication as well. They also spent lots of time looking at their plants and which conditions were best for the plant to grow. We also began our journey of learning about Florence Nightingale in history. This week Year 1 have been thinking about the reasons why Captain Scott didn't make it to the South Pole first. They have been drawing some Starry Nights in art, doing woodland scavenger hunts with hot chocolate, completing number lines in Maths and much more!

This week, Year 5 have carried out a science investigation to see which material would be the best insulator for a new lunchbox. They planned this investigation, organised all their resources, collected results and drawn conclusions from these. They are fantastic scientists in the making.

This week in Year 4 we have had a fun first week back. In science we finished our 'living things and their habitats' unit. We had a go at using a classification table to group animals based on their characteristics. Using this information, we created a classification key. After completing this we looked forward to our new unit of 'Sound'.
