## This week in school we have...

Year 2 started their week with Victorian Day. They had great fun dressing up and experiencing how strict the teachers were. Apparently it was the best day ever! They have also enjoyed learning about multiplication as well as exploring Holy Week in RE. In history they have been learning more about Florence Nightingale and why she decided to go to the Crimea in in the first place. This week in Year 4 we have investigated different National Parks of the USA! We looked at whereabouts the Parks are and what animals live within them. We will use this later in our writing topic to help think of different reasons why we should or shouldn't feed animals in the Parks.

This week Reception Class have been continuing to look at the story of The Hungry Caterpillar and the life cycle of a butterfly. They also learnt about some different baby animals and had a very exciting visit from Mark's Ark – they got to see lots of interesting animals and learn all about them.

Year 1 have had a fun packed week with cricket, animals in the classroom and woodland adventures. All of this in between learning about Judaism and writing our recounts and finishing our numbers to 20 unit.

This week Year 3 have been creating their Egyptian collars using tissues and glue to create 3d effects in Art. They have also started some diary writing for Literacy, imagining they are William Carter opening Tutankhamun's Tomb.

Year 5 have had another superb week of learning. We have been really getting to grips with long multiplication and showing great resilience in this. In RE we have been looking and exploring what we see in our 'big frieze', and discussing how what we are learning in RE at present fits into the big picture. We were also lucky enough to have a great PE session with a visiting cricket coach.

Year 6 have continued their learning about Islam across Britain and looking at similarities and differences between Baghdad and Cordoba in Spain. They have examined their rich lifestyles and are using their research and learning to plan a report and PowerPoint on their findings. They have finished their unit on decimals and are able to divide and multiply fractions by integers and divide fractions to convert into percentages. They have just started to prepare for the Mothering Sunday cards using various painting techniques but I can't tell you too much about that! They are very excited about their charity event this week so you will hear about how successful they were in next week's Newsletter.
