## This week in school we have.....

What a wonderful first week back in Reception class! We have begun our new topic by immersing ourselves in the World of Julia Donaldson and introduced the story of Zog. The children enjoyed sharing their proudest achievements and expressed their creativity by making dragon crafts. In phonics, we learned the sounds 'or' and 'air' while in maths we explored different ways to count and group numbers. Then, in RE, the children have looked at special places and discussed what is special to them.

This week in Year 1 we started our new book Grandad's Island and we went a journey of our own on a ship (in the classroom). We started counting in 2,5 and 10's. We have also started our new seaside topic, we looked at the differences of a seaside holiday over 100 years ago. We also started our swimming lessons and prepping for sports day.

This week the Year 3's have started their new topic about Cornwall and have been looking at maps, locating different places of interest on them as well as identifying the different regions of the United Kingdom. They have completed some lovely water colour pictures of the Eden Project in Art. In Maths we have been learning about volume and capacity and in Literacy we have enjoyed our new class story about a book eating boy by Oliver Jeffers. The children have taken inspiration from this to write their own humorous book blurbs.

Year 6 have come back after the Easter break with an outstanding work ethic. They have been working hard on becoming more fluent and confident in multiples, factors and fractions of amounts. In English, they have a better understanding of determiners, adverbials and apostrophes. In RE, they are finishing off their unit on the resurrection, and they are creating very thought-provoking discussions. In Science, we started our biology topic of classification, and their classification trees are amazing! Ella even brought in her sunflower seed plant which she grew following Michelle's assembly – it is fab! So relevant to science this term too 😊

This week Year 2 have started looking at The Owl Who was Afraid of the Dark. They had a firework experience day which involved making explosions with coke and mentoes as well as watching the Disney firework show. In maths they have been exploring fractions and finding out about halves. They remembered their work about continents and oceans from year 1 and used a map to find Africa. In RE they started to think about Muslims and learn some of the important information about their faith. It has been a busy first week back!

Year 4 have started the Summer term full of enthusiasm and keen to learn. In our Geography lessons, we have been thinking about what mountains are - identifying valleys, rivers, mountains and peaks. We have also found out about populations in different countries and this has given us a starting point for our RE topic - What does it mean to be a Hindu in Britain today. In our science, we learnt about places in the world that have 4, 3 and 2 seasons and used the internet to find out about the habitats within these - developing our research skills.

This week in English, Year 5 explored what makes a good biography. We identified the key features and writing techniques used in biographies, including how to organise information clearly, write in chronological order, and use formal language to describe a person's life and achievements. In History, we began our new topic on crime and punishment in the medieval period. We looked at the types of crimes committed at the time and the different punishments that were used. We discussed how these punishments reflected the beliefs and laws of medieval society. In Science, we started learning about reproduction in plants. We explored the two different ways plants reproduce: sexual reproduction through seed dispersal and asexual reproduction using different parts of the plant.
