This week in school we have...

Year 6 have been busy deepening their knowledge of the Islamic religion. Our new history topic, Islam across Britain, ties in nicely with their RE topic and they have produced some fantastic time lines and learnt about Eid this week. We held a surprise teddy bears picnic on Wednesday as we said goodbye to Mrs Buckley, we wish her well in her new school. This week Year 2 have enjoyed learning more about the Owl who was afraid of the dark story. They enjoyed experiencing a campfire just like Plop and deciding whether toasting marshmallows was fun! In maths they have been fraction crazy and have been able to find quarters and halves. They continued to find out about Africa and located it on a map as well as finding out about how to write a key. Along with acting out the good Samaritan and creating the most amazing African patterns in art - it has been a very busy week!

This week Reception class had to work in small groups to create their own Zog land. They had big bits of paper to draw on and created lands including castles, mountains, beaches and more dragons. They have also been busy doing some tricky adding and exploring the woods - some children are sure they found some dinosaur teeth!

This week Year 3 have been completing their poems about a creature who ate their school. They have also been learning about Counties and in particular Cornwall. They learnt about pollination in Science and did some art exploring seeds within fruit and used mixed mediums to create their sketches.

This week Year 1 have been learning about pirates in History and enjoying their new pirate role play area. They have also been writing some super sentences about our class story, "The Queen's Hat" and grouping different items in Maths.

This week, Year 4 have enjoyed planting seeds ready for their Royal Cornwall Show exhibit. We have been busy using our ICT skills to research the different parts of food chains in readiness for our writing. In maths, we have been busy learning about fractions and becoming more confident with all of our times tables.

In English, Year 5 are continuing to write their narrative One Small Step, this week they have explored using pathetic fallacy, repetition for effect, relative clauses and modal verbs. In Maths, we have been learning about tenths, hundredths and thousandths of a whole. In RE, Year 5 have learnt about the 10 Gurus of Sikh religion. In Music, we enjoyed singing and playing the ukelele and reading musical notes to help us play together as a group. Finally in computing, the children researched the temperature and rainfall in a country of their choice in South America and then produced a graph to compare it to Saltash.
