Playing out of their skins the entire tournament they beat the 7 other finalists to take a very well-deserved win. This now qualifies them to play in the ESFA County Finals at Falmouth on November 24th. A huge well done, the whole school is very proud of you.

This week in school we have...

This week in Year 4 we have been working hard on our new English topic 'The Creature', looking at plastic pollution in the seas, and how it harms the different ocean wildlife that we know of, as well as wildlife that may still be undiscovered.RE this week was a productive and thoughtful session summarising what both Christians and ourselves can learn from 'The Creation story' as well as the story of 'Adam and Eve'. The class shared some really thoughtful and mature ideas and conversations. To further this discussion, they used Bibles where they started learning how to navigate a Bible and find the parables that we have been studying. This week Year 5 have been finishing off their extended artwork pieces. Over the past few weeks, they have been developing skills in sketching, working with pastels, blending and using Brusho. We are really proud of their results. We've also enjoyed finding clues and evidence to see if there might be any truth in the legend 'Theseus and the Minotaur'.

This week Year 2 learnt a lot about recycling and they created their own recycling plant in the classroom. In literacy they have been showing what super readers they are and in maths have been using their number bonds to 10 to add. They have begun to think about the Christmas story and are already proving to be amazing singers of the Christmas play songs! This week Year 3 have been practising turns and forward rolls in PE and recreating miniature versions of Stone Henge outside in the woods. They have also been learning about how ceremonies were celebrated in the Stone Age.

This week Reception Class learnt about bonfire night. They made handprint bonfires and used their imagination to create their own rockets. They had great fun making them fly and zoom through the sky! This week Year 1 have been writing our Firework poems and enjoying toasting marshmallows in the woods. We have been doing some firework art and singing our hearts out learning our Nativity songs.

Year 6 have had a very busy week carrying out electrical science experiments. They set up an experiment to create a circuit then predicted what would happen. They thought about variables to ensure theirs were fair tests. They had lots of fun! They have also finished off their creative scripture art reflecting on their favourite readings inspired by pieces of art by Christian artist Hannah Dunnett.
