This week in school we have.....

This week in Reception, we have been exploring how churches celebrate Easter in RE. The children enjoyed learning about all the different traditions and are looking forward to performing our song at the Easter service next week - they've been busy practising!

For our topic, we have begun writing about different minibeasts, describing what they look like and what they do. We also have created some beautiful seasonal paintings, thinking carefully about the changes we can see happening around us as spring arrives. In phonics, our focus sounds were oo and ar, and in maths the children have learnt about doubles.

This week in Year 1, we have had a lot of fun taste testing in science and completing our big write. We have been rehearsing for the Easter service and doing some art and much more.

This week Year 2 have been amazing at doing reading and maths quizzes and were super confident in their skills. They really enjoyed exploring healthy eating and exercise in science and produced some amazing balanced food plates to show their learning. They have made some beautiful Easter eggs in RE and are really good at explaining the Easter story. In geography they used their work from last week to explore the similarities and differences between here and the Atlas Mountains and do this with real enthusiasm. Another super week!

This week in Year 3 the children enjoyed their Egyptian Day where they dressed up in traditional costumes, enjoyed making a sarcophagus and putting a mummy inside it as well as doing lots of code breaking and interpreting hieroglyphics. They made a cartouche of their name and played Egyptian games. They also have completed their independent write based around Howard Carter's diary entries.

Year 4 have been learning all about living animals in their habitats. This week we have been finding out about how animals are adapted to live in their environments. We had great fun designing a new animal which would need to be suited and adapted to its habitat. We came up with some amazing ideas - really thinking of the features the animal would need. In our RE, we have been considering the feelings of Mary over the Easter week and the feelings Christians may also have at this time. A super week, Year 4.

This week in Year 6, we have been exploring measurement and algebra, and writing some excellent reports about the Islamic Golden Age.

In PSHE, we created cubes filled with ideas for how to stay calm and in RE we had a thoughtful discussion about the Big Freeze.

This week in Maths, Year 5 have been learning about area and line graphs, developing our skills in measuring space and interpreting data. In English, the children have completed and carefully edited their balanced arguments, focusing on presenting both sides of a topic clearly and thoughtfully. In History, we explored different types of historical evidence to help us decide whether the Maya civilization was simply bloodthirsty or more civilized than we first thought.
