

This week in school.....

This week in Reception, we have been exploring all things The Gruffalo! The children have enjoyed a range of activities including writing, subitising, and lots of creative learning through play. We've been busy using playdough, painting, and much more to bring the story to life.

This week the Year 3's have created some drawings of Cornish engine houses and have learnt about why they are an important part of our regional heritage. They have also been learning about smuggling and wrecking and taken inspiration for this in their writing, imagining they are smugglers trying to hide goods in a Cornish cove. They learnt about one of the famous Cornish smugglers, John Carter and wrote a letter trying to recruit other shipmates, imagining they were him on his sea adventures around Cornwall.

This week in Year 5, we have been exploring different gestation periods for a variety of mammals and comparing how they differ across species. In RE, we learned about the Jewish holy text, the Torah, and explored why it is so significant to the Jewish faith. In History, we investigated why crime rates fluctuated during the 19th century and examined the different punishments that were introduced during this period.

This week in Year 1 we have been finishing our Story the Storm Whale ready to write our own version next week. We have been doing some numbers to 100 through games. We have also been phonics superstars!

This week Year 2 have been learning about Rosa Parks and why she was famous, the class were really engaged and loved learning about her. In science, we are learning about why habitats are changing and what impact humans have today. We have continued to have lots of fun in ICT making our own music. This week, animals inspired our music and the class shared some of their songs inspired by different animals. We have also been getting ready for sports day in PE by practicing our different activities. In art, we have been getting used to using clay as well as learning some joining techniques.

Year 4 have been enjoying their English unit of work 'The Creature' this week - it is based upon plastic pollution which the children are interested in. We have also linked this to our music lessons and have begun writing our own compositions for this short film. In maths this week, we have been learning about the properties of 2d shapes. The children had fun reinforcing the concepts learnt through playing some practical games. Well done on the hard work Year 4.

With the World Cup upon us and the focus on Justice in school, in Year 6 this week the children have begun to research the nations involved and ask 'How fair is the World Cup?', thinking especially about the nature of the qualifying countries, the resources they have and how far they are going to have to travel just to take part. Final preparations are also being made for the Young Entrepreneurs event on Friday. The children are busily designing experiences, creating products and finishing off their advertising, all to raise money for Cancer Research UK.

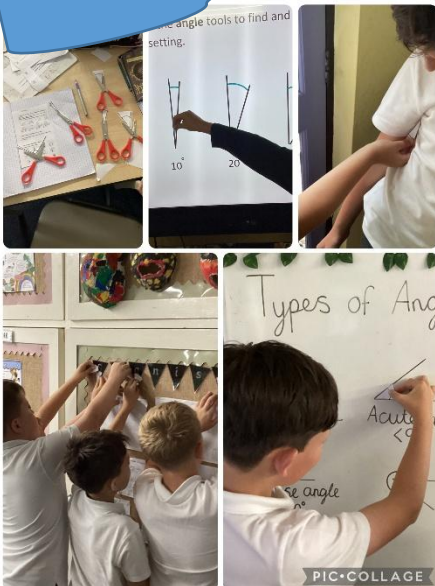
