This week in school.....

We have had another busy but very warm week in Reception! We started the week by learning about rainforest animals and habitats after reading our story of the week, *Monkey Puzzle*. On Tuesday, the children enjoyed their Moving Up Morning, spending time in their new Year 1 classroom and meeting their new teachers. We also took part in our long-awaited Sports Day on Wednesday, where the children showed fantastic enthusiasm, determination and teamwork. We are so proud of how well they participated and tried their very best!

A busy week of sports from watching the football and then the big sports day. Well done to all of Year 1. In between this we have been meeting our new teachers. Learning time and much more 😊

This week Year 2 have had a great week with the definite highlight being sports day. They enjoyed writing their non chronological reports on lions and did an amazing job. They also enjoyed having a go at the new maths that we will be starting in September. They have also learnt more about how important it is to give to others for Muslims and thought what they would give. They enjoyed more art activities with Miss Underdown and also had a brilliant morning in Year 3 - they were super stars.

This week the Year 3s have been learning more about our beautiful region of Cornwall and the history of Saint Piran. They also put in an amazing performance for sports day showing resilience, perseverance and team work with one of the highlights definitely being their sheer determination with the tug of war!

Year 4 have had a super week. What fabulous teamwork we saw on sports day, all supporting each other, children stepping in to fill in other teams if numbers were short and trying their absolute best. In Design and Technology (DT), we constructed the chassis for our slingshot cars and are now ready to add the axles and wheels. In RE, we explored how people who follow the Jewish faith have adapted festivals such as Passover to be more inclusive in today's society.

This week has seen the children spend a day at their new secondary schools. It sounds like everyone is very excited about moving up, coming back with tales of sporting victories (all be it with accompanying cuts and grazes), gastronomic wonders spotted in the canteen and new friends made.

To cap off their Spanish studies at Bishop Cornish, the Y6 class partook in an afternoon of tapas last week where they were able to try lots of delicious foods from Spain in Saltash's version of an almost Mediterranean summer. 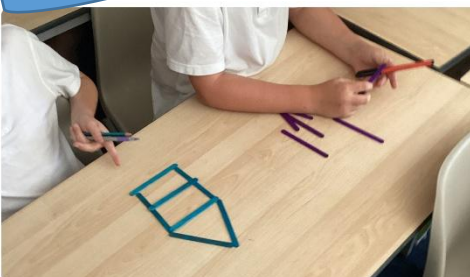
