In Flanders Fields

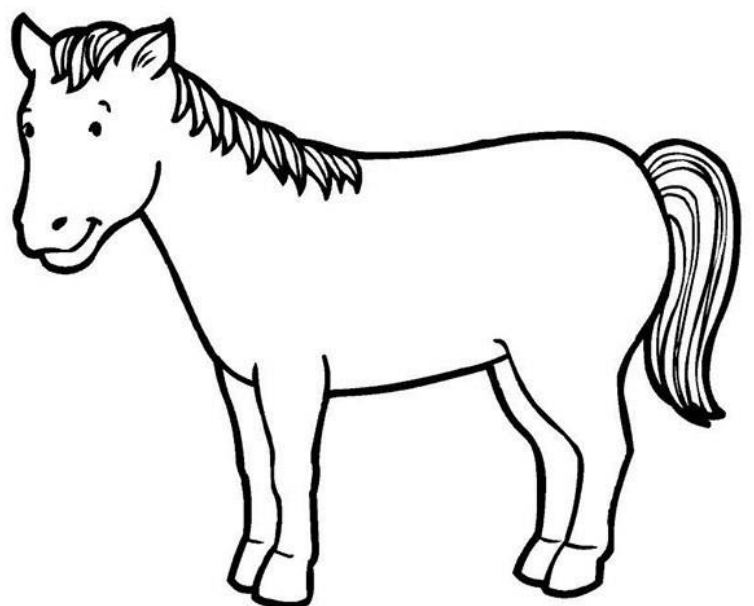
In Flanders fields the poppies blow

- Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae

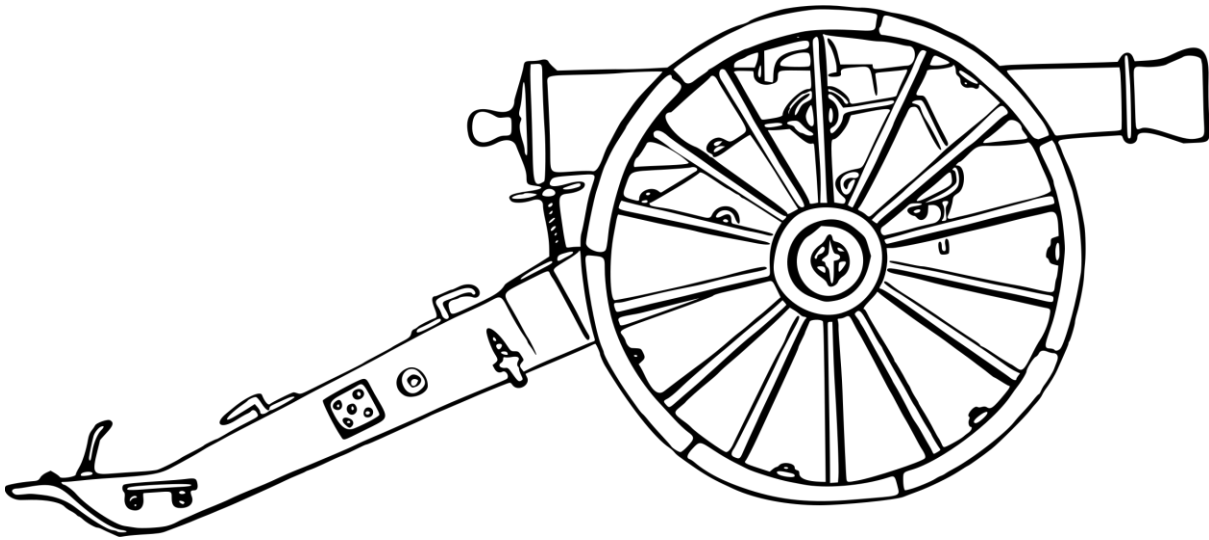
