This week in school we have...

This week Year 2 have had great fun writing more of their stardust story. We have explored empathy and we wrote a beautiful poem. In Maths we have shown how amazing we are at addition and subtraction and what we have remembered about shape. We found out about the Shema prayer in RE and were amazing history detectives when we looked at some Victorian photographs. In ICT we wrote our own algorithms and then predicted where our beebots would travel.

This week Year 1 have been looking at 'Starry Night' by Van Gogh and creating their own versions using pastels. They have also been learning about the story of creation in RE and looking at the different features of maps in Geography. This week in Year 3 we have been painting rainbows and thinking about God's promise to Noah. We also made a compass with a magnet, and it led us to treasure. We continued our Earthquake reports and Multiplication and division in Maths ©

In Year 4 this week, we have managed to get outside and practise our netball skills. In maths we have been all working really hard with understanding how times tables are calculated and looking at ways to represent these. Science was particular funny today as we were learning all about the digestive system - some very interesting pictures and facts!

This week Reception Class learnt about Chinese New Year as part of their celebrations topic in RE. They have also explored different 2d and 3d shapes and made their own shape dinosaurs. They also had a visit from a wizard who has left instructions of how to finally help hatch their egg! This week Year 6 have been researching how religion preferences have changed since the last census. They have been examining data between 2011 and 2021, with a focus on Christianity and Islam. They then used maths skills to produce accurate charts and diagrams, explaining why they think the numbers practising Christianity have dropped significantly in Cornwall. We have also started our Shang Dynasty topic and the children are already excited about researching this topic for history/geography.

This week Year 5 have been sharing their own history of WWII and what life was like for their Great Grandparents. We continued to explore the book Rose Blanche in English and listen to music from that era. In Computing we are starting to explore how computers work: what is an input, process and output. In Maths, Year 5 are adding and subtracting fractions with mixed denominators. During our time in the woods, we made fractions of shape, found fractions of measurements and looked at equivalent fractions.
