Handwriting

Maths .

Yesterday you were practising giving change from £10 and £20 in your mini shop.

Today I would like you to practise some more and if you are feeling confident turn the price labels over and on the back write slightly trickier numbers for example; £2.50, £3.50 etc

Remember half of 10 is 5 so half of 100 is 50. 100 pence (100p) is the same as £1 so half of £1 is 50 pence (50p). Don't worry if you find this a bit tricky as we will be having plenty more practice!

Watch the BBC Bitesize maths, money video on giving change and there is a quiz too to have a go at. Also try the website ICT games and have a go at the game 'Pay For It'.
