This week in school we have.....

This week in Reception class, we began exploring the Easter story, learning about what happened to Jesus and why this time of year is so special to Christians. We continued our new beginnings topic and took a closer look at the life cycle of a bean where the child loved discovering how a tiny seed can grow into a plant - we can't wait to grow our own plants next week! The highlight of our week was our exciting visit from Mark's Ark. We learned all about different species of animals and some of us were brave enough to hold them! Such a fun filled week!

This week the Year 3s have been learning all about hieroglyphics as part of their topic about Ancient Egypt and learnt how to spell their names with the ancient symbols. They have also compared different settlements in Geography, using their map reading skills to identify grid references and different map symbols. As part of Science week they have also been learning about plants and flowers and it has been great to see so many involved with the School Science Fair on Wednesday.

Year 6 this week have been writing up their non chronological reports on the Golden Age of Islam. They are showcasing their history, RE and English knowledge in this piece of writing. On Tuesday, they had a fab visit to Saltash Library where they learnt all about moths and butterflies. We all learned something new! They also got very creative with watercolours and have used their artistic flair to make their Mothering Sunday cards; they are beautiful.

This week in Year 1 has been action packed with animal encounters, science fairs and so much in between.

This week Year 2 have been busy writing more poetry ideas about how they would run the world and what kind of person they would choose. In maths they have finished measuring and started to work on working out which things is heavier or lighter. They have explored what we need to survive in science and made a map of our walk in geography. They also explored more about Florence Nightingale and came up with reasons as to why she went to Crimea.

Year 4 have had another super week. In art, we have been colour mixing some beautiful colours, found in nature and using watercolours. It was lovely to see a couple of entries from Year 4 for our science fair - well done. As it's science week. We've covered lots of science too, looking at how we can classify animals and the different habitats which animals live in. Year 4 have worked exceptionally hard in their maths, really getting to grips with fractions - well done to everyone.

This week in Year 5, we have been researching different types of rivers and exploring their features, shapes, and sizes in geography. In PSHE, we learned about the emergency services and practiced the recovery position, discussing how it can help keep someone safe in an emergency. In maths, the children have been working hard on decimals. They have been learning how to round decimals to the nearest whole number and to one decimal place. In RE, we explored how the Bible describes God as holy, loving, omnipotent, and omniscient. The children had thoughtful discussions about what these ideas mean.
