This week in school we have...

Year 6 have been busy revisiting tricky topics in preparation for their SATs. They have been amazing and so resilient; I am so proud of them. We have finished our Islamic art as you will see in the photo. We have made a display in the corridor showcasing their finished designs as they are so outstanding. They used geometry knowledge from maths and their knowledge of the colour wheel which they learnt about in art. This week Year 2 have settled back into school amazingly well. They have worked really hard at their writing and used some amazing adjectives and punctuation in their owl stories. They have been practising their multiplication skills in maths as well as doubling and halving with ease. They enjoyed an afternoon of exploring colour with water colours. We started our topic on Africa by finding out about Kenya and recapping our knowledge about the world, we are looking forward to finding out more over the next term.

This week Year 3 have been learning about Pentecost, we used oil pastels to give our responses to an image of the Holy Spirit. We have also thought about what we know about Cornwall and enjoyed some time in the woods. In maths we have been finishing our fractions unit and in English we have been enjoying some performance poetry in readiness to write our own next week. We have also planned our own plant investigations in Science.

This week Year 4 have been learning about fractions, using practical equipment and working in groups. In Geography we have been learning about different climates in Spain and in English, we have been doing some fantastic writing about the digestive system.

This week Year 1 have been getting inspired with literacy and drama activities based around the story, 'The Queen's hat,' as well as looking at photos of Buckingham Palace. They have also been studying world maps in Geography and learning about seasonal changes in Science.

This week Reception class have been learning all about the story of Zog. They made their own stars to give to a friend, created paper dragons and made an obstacle course to think about the challenges Zog faced!

In English, Year 5 started writing their narrative One Small Step. In Maths, they have been looking at decimals: comparing them to fractions, writing them on number lines and using place value grids to show their value with counters. In RE, Year 5 have learnt how Guru Nanak founded the Sikh religion. In Music, we have started learning the ukelele and learnt crochet and quaver beats. In Art, they created collages based on the highest earning living artist in South America, Beatriz Milhazes. One of her paintings sold for £2.1 million in 2000. Finally in Geography, the children learnt the 12 countries and 2 territories of South America.
