



Everyone probably knows the 1973 Christmas no. 1 single *Merry Xmas Everybody* by Slade, but did you know it was actually recorded in late summer? Recording in a studio hallway, the band remembered getting funny looks as they sang about Santa and Christmas

stockings in September.

I thought of this as I sat down in dreary, penitential mid-Lenten March to write a newsletter item for April – the month of Spring and Easter and festivity. The same sense of having to use one's

imagination to jump forward in time; racking one's brain to remember what a hot cross bun or crème egg tastes like.

Or is it the same, I wondered? (And not just because, as far as the shops are concerned, it has pretty much been Easter since January 1st...)

Lent, Holy Week, and Easter are special times of the year. We do special things and sing special songs. But that doesn't mean that what we do then is completely different from the rest of the year. It's not some topsy-turvy medieval festival of misrule. It's not like the last day of school,

where, instead of lessons, you watch the Lion King on video. It's not like a raucous office fancy dress party, where all the rules of normal working life seem thrown out the window (though HR might disagree). It's not like putting a tree inside your house, eating chocolate for breakfast.

Instead, the special things we do in Lent, Holy Week and Easter really draw on – and draw out – different aspects of what we do all year round.

In Holy Week we reflect at great length on Jesus' institution of Holy Communion and his death for us on the Cross of Calvary. These of course appear in our communion liturgy each Sunday. But, more than that, they sum up the whole life and work of the Son of God: who gives himself to us in a union of friendship and love, and gives himself for us, saving us from death and sin

And in Easter, we celebrate the living presence of the risen Lord Jesus – at work among us in his Spirit even today – by recalling that glorious day that is the first day of our eternal lives.

To paraphrase Noddy Holder: I wish it could be Lent and Holy Week and Easter every day. But, by the grace of God, it is!

given we still have Covid hanging around. This was the largest number sent in all the years we have been contributing. Some of the destinations were Albania, Belarus, and Bosnia.


I hope we will continue to support the Appeal for many years to come.
