Playing against much bigger and more experienced players, in an excellent game, we eventually lost 6-5. Well done to the team, brilliantly captained by Bella. This week in school we have...

This week in Year 4 we have started looking at Roald Dahl's 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory'. We spent the first lesson reading some of the books and watching some scenes from the film. We also made some of our own chocolate bars that we think we would see in Wonka's factory.

Year 2 were thrilled when Timmy the Tortoise returned from his hibernation. They have been enjoying sharing their learning with him. We have enjoyed exploring 'The Owl who was Afraid of the Dark' story and have learnt all about owls as well as exploring explosions and fireworks in the woods. They have also been reviewing their learning about Islam and finding out about fractions.

This week in Reception Class we have been looking at the book 'Zog'. We have learned to draw a dragon and label him. We have also made our own junk modelling Zogs. In maths we are getting more and more confident in using our numbers and adding numbers together. This week Year 1 started our new topic about the seaside and wrote postcards. We also went swimming and looked at plants in the woods, along with starting our new book called 'Grandad's Island'.

This week Year 3 have been taking inspiration from a local seascape artist, Sue Reid and creating their own pieces of art using hand painting and a range of materials. They have also enjoyed their first swimming lesson as part of PE and started their new topic about Cornwall and the local area.

Year 5 have had a lovely start to the summer term. They have enjoyed finding out about the process of metamorphosis in amphibians and insects – finding clues hidden around the room to help them to understand the different life cycles. We have enjoyed using the microbits within our ICT lessons and will soon become experts at programming these.

Year 6 have been working hard in maths, investigating shapes, areas and perimeters. They then solved tricky problems using compound shapes, angles and formulae to calculate their answers. In the run up to SATs, we are focussing our English lessons around SPaG, this week we have looked at adverbials and relative clauses. They created their own sentences and understand the rules for punctuation when using them. In RE, we researched the 4 synoptic Gospels. They used Bbles to compare the events of Jesus' life and Parables told within them. They produced very comprehensive concept maps outlining their learning.
