## This week in school we have.....

This week Year 2 wrote some amazing stories about a character who was jealous. They showed off their super handwriting skills and used some amazing words with super spelling. In maths they learnt all about division and how to share objects. They are very excited about next weeks Victorian day and we got ready by finding out about Victorian schools. We explored a mosque in RE and the children were very good at labelling the key parts and talking respectfully about another faith. In science we talked about how different plants were adapted for different habitats and the children were amazed to hear all about the cacao tree.

This week in Reception class, we have been learning the sounds 'z' and 'ch' in phonics, explored length in maths by comparing objects as longer and shorter, and added more to our dinosaur fact files! In RE, we discovered how babies are welcomed in Islam. We also had lots of fun during our woods session.

This week in Year 1 we have been super authors writing our stories. We have been reasoning in maths. We came up with some super ideas on how we could commemorate Captain Scott in a different way.

Following our Art lesson last week, this week Year 3 spent some time exploring colour mixing. They identified the primary colours and practised mixing different shades and tones of secondary colours. In History they were fascinated to learn about the process of mummification. In music we have continued to explore Reggae music. We think Bob Marley's 'Three little birds' has a great message and have been singing it regularly in our classroom!

In Geography this week Year 4 have been looking at where different foods are produced in the UK. Did you know that Vinny Blue Cheese comes from Dorset? In PE we have been working hard practising for the Indoor Athletics competitions which a lot of us are competing in. We have practised relay changeovers, obstacle races and lots of full events like speed bounce and vertical jump. A super week, well done Year 4.

This week in Year 5, we have been busy creating our Mayan masks using Mod Roc. The children have been working hard in maths, dividing numbers up to four digits and multiplying unit and non-unit fractions. In history, we explored the amazing ruins of Chichen Itza and learned about its important features. In RE, the children planned their travel guides to Mecca and explored what Muslims may need to prepare before making the journey.

Year 6 have been converting units of measurement and practising their times table challenge. They have been busy finishing and editing their stories based on The Journey. Their writing is amazing. They are continuing to learn how Islam spread across Britain for their history topic and they started their Light topic for science.
