## This week in school we have...

Year 6 have been studying the Shang Dynasty and sketching artefacts from that period of time. They have been drafting their reports ensuring they include all the information they have learnt about the Shang Dynasty. They have been learning about prescribed and illegal drugs as part of PHSE and were very mature in their discussions. Year 6 were also asked to write a job description for a vicar – they were so thoughtful about the qualities needed, Truro Diocese were blown away! In English Year 5 have finished writing their newspaper report about Goldilocks and will be writing their own version next week. During woods time, the children explored another fairy tale using drama and thought about which characters they want to include in their report. In Maths, Year 5 have been exploring equivalent fractions and multiplying fractions. In music the children are learning the very fast rap 'Fresh Prince of Bel Air' and compared it to De La Soul 'Me, Myself and I'. This week's photo shows the amazing sketches the children drew with charcoal based on L S Lowry.

This week in Year 3 the children have been making posters about deforestation. And continuing our 'Flood' story unit in preparation for writing our own at the end of next week. We have been setting ourselves fitness goals as part of our 'Healthy Me' unit in PSHE and much more. This week Reception class had a fun filled day at the zoo. They saw all sorts of animals and had a great day. They have also spent time this week painting like Picasso and learning about Holi, they celebrated by painting each other's faces.

This week Year 1 have been learning why Easter is important for Christians, designing a fruit kebab and learning about different animals on our Key Stage 1 trip to Paignton Zoo. This week Year 4 have really enjoyed PE lessons the dance moves the children create are brilliant! We have enjoyed using Scratch in ICT, have become so much more confident (after persevering) with written multiplication in maths and have enjoyed learning about the gut microbes in English. In our science lesson this week, we have set up an investigation to see what drinks may cause tooth decay...we will be collecting the results over the next week as part of science week.

This week Year 2 have been looking at recounts in preparation for their visit to the zoo. They have also been finishing off their unit of work on money and doing some problem solving. We have started to look at easter in RE and have been acting out different parts of the story – I was amazed at the children's efforts with this. We carried on thinking about materials in science and worked out why certain materials are suitable for making certain objects such as a toaster. We also started using our knowledge of levers and sliders to make some special cards!
