## Cornwall School Games Qualifier for Tennis and Cricket

Well done to all the children who represented the school so well at Launceston College on Wednesday. Our Boys Cricket team played superbly all day to become East Cornwall Champions, our Year 3/4 Tennis team came 2nd, thus qualifying for the Cornwall School Games Final, the Year 5/6 Tennis Team also came 2<sup>nd</sup> and the Girls Cricket Team came 3rd. With all the qualifying competitions over, it means we have qualified for the CSG Finals in: Touch Rugby, Tri Golf, Year 3/4 Quad Kids Athletics, Year 5/6 Quad Kids Athletics, Boys Cricket, Year 3/4 Tennis and Year 5/6 Tennis, meaning we will be taking an incredible 52 KS2 children to St Austell on Friday 1<sup>st</sup> July for the Cornwall School Games Finals. # This week in school and at home

Year 2 really enjoyed playing the glockenspiels in our music lesson this week. They had fun exploring and creating their own tunes, then learnt how to follow notes to accompany a South African song. The children are also very excited that we have set up our new African house roleplay, and have already had lots of fun dressing up, pretending to collect water, firewood, and pick vegetables from the garden. This week Year 1 have been very busy using their amazing phonics skills. They have also learnt about halves and quarters in maths and this involved eating cake! In other areas they have been learning about seasons, beginning to find out about Muslims and thinking about how we travel on holiday and building different vehicles.

This week Reception class have travelled the world with the Snail and the Whale. They used Google Earth to explore different countries and made their own maps for bee-bots to travel around.

Year 5 children have been away at Heatree for their residential trip. They have had an amazing time and been an absolute credit to the school. This week Year 4 have been learning about money in Maths. In English we have been writing play scripts about the story of Romulus and Remus. In History we've been designing our Roman shields and in PSHE we have been learning how to resolve problems in play. In RE we have been learning how Jesus' disciples gave up special things to follow him.

This week Year 3 have been continuing our learning within the Captivating Cornwall topic. We have started to learn the story of The Mousehole Cat and we wrote some detailed descriptions of a setting. We also completed some Geography, where we focused on how a river is formed and found the source of the Tamar River and we tracked it on a map.

Year & have been extremely busy this week learning about South America in Geography -Peru in particular; writing stories with a South American twist; learning about biological inheritance from DNA to ear lobes(!); discussing a maths business project in maths...(*more to come!*) as well as welcoming a little chick (Nugget!) into the world!
