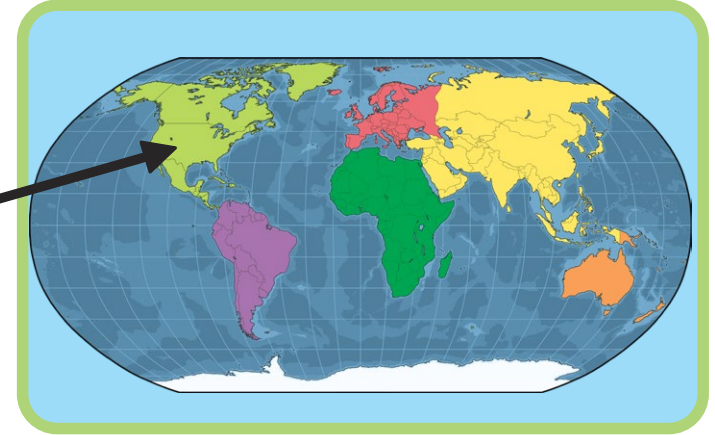

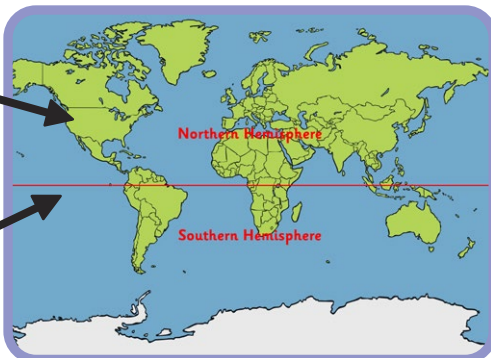


North America Fact Cards

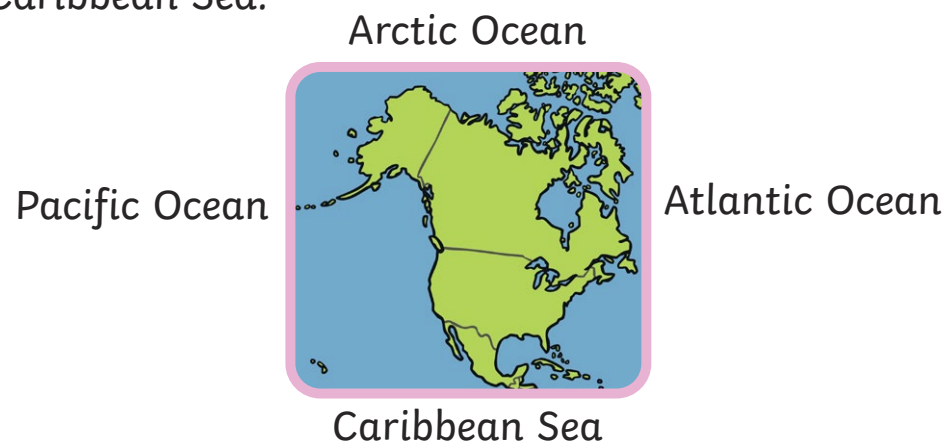
North America is home to many wild animals. These include raccoons, black bears, alligators, bald eagles, Canadian geese and beavers.

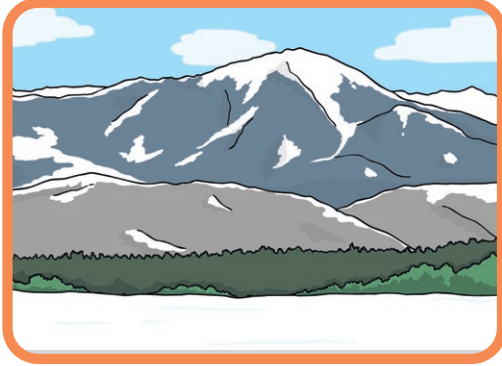
North America is surrounded by the Atlantic Ocean, the Arctic Ocean, the Pacific Ocean and the Caribbean Sea.

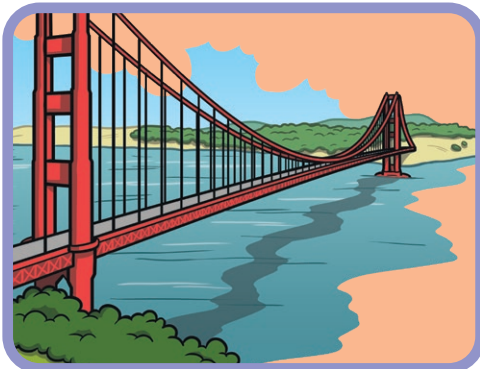
The longest river in North America is the Missouri, which is in the USA. It is 3767 kilometres long.
