Today keep practising the days of the week - how many can you spell without looking? Use the sheet to help you.

Today we are going to write what we think Traction man and the other characters might be saying in the pictures (on the sheet). When someone is speaking we use speech marks. These also have a grown up name - 'inverted commas', but it is fine for you to call them speech marks

for now. They look like this and they go at the beginning and end of what someone is saying, as if they are holding on to it. Any punctuation goes inside the speech marks, like this:

"Would you like some cake?" said Mrs Hill.

It gets a bit boring if we always use the word **Said**, so your first job today is to think of other words that we could use, and make a list. I will start you off: shouted, whispered,

roared,

I wonder what other words you can think of? Once you have done this, write what the characters might be saying in each picture, trying to use a different one of your words each time.
