This week Year 2 have been amazing at maths as they get to grips with multiplication and division. They have also been perfecting their use of question marks and writing letters to the zoo about their favourite animals. We have worked hard on the Easter story and thought carefully about resurrection and what this is. In science we have thought about recycling, and we have learnt all about Florence Nightingale and why she is famous. We are very glad that she changed hospitals for the better!

This week Year 1have been thinking about the Easter Story and created some artwork reflecting on how the story changes from sadness to happiness, using the themes of darkness and light in their drawings. They have also been writing recounts about their recent trip to the zoo and making healthy fruit faces in Design Technology. Year 5 had a visit to Plymouth this week investigating the effects of WW2. In English this week the children finished their newspaper reports and should all be very proud of their amazing writing, I know that I was really impressed reading them. In Maths Year 5 have been finding fractions of a quantity. In RE, Year 5 investigated 'What did Jesus do to save human beings?' In Music they have been comparing The Fresh Prince of Bel Air to Ready or Not by The Fugees. Finally in History, the children are now creating a fact file about World War 2.

> This week Year 3 have been perfecting their performance for the Easter Service, writing up our Flood stories and continuing our fractions work.

This week Reception class have been watching their sunflower seeds and cress grow. Every day they have been excited to see how much they have changed and how much they have grown. They have also been learning about Easter and made the most of the sunshine by painting pictures outside. This week, Year 4 have been learning all about food chains in science and sketching animals in food chains in our art sessions. We have worked very hard learning our song for the Easter service next week, focussing on what it may have been like for Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane and reflecting in our own lives upon a time when we may have felt lonely or afraid. This week's photos are part of some freeze frame drama work about what loneliness might look like.

This week, Year 6 have had a visit from author Rob Holmes. The children loved listening to his stories and taking part in some mindfulness activities. They have also been revisiting the Islamic faith, learning about Muhammed (PBUH) and how the press can distort stories about different faiths. We have also been practising our scene of the Crucifixion ready for our Easter Service next week.
