Dear parents and carers,

Welcome back to 2022 at Bishop Cornish! I very much hope that you have had a lovely Christmas and got to spend precious time with your loved ones. The children have returned to school in high spirits, ready to learn and start the new year off. It was an absolute joy to see their smiling faces as they walked into school on Wednesday.

In Collective Worship this week our focus was Epiphany, where we reflected on how the wise men might have felt going on a journey, following the stars to meet Jesus. An activity that the children could do at home is to view the night sky and draw or write down what they see. I would love to see their work!

It is great to see that so many of you have joined Class Dojo. I hope that you find this form of communication helpful. The system enables you to directly contact your child's class teacher through the message icon, and view what is happening in class as teachers share either by commentary, video or photos. As parents you can like what you see by tapping the heart icon and make comments. At the moment the story page is for you as parents/carers to see what is happening in school. As we introduce more aspects of the system, the children will be able to log in and upload their work at which point they can write comments to share with you and their class teacher. If your child is currently off school but well enough to work and is accessing the home learning, you might want to try this out. We will also be using Class Dojo as part of our reward system. You will be notified when your child receives a positive point. The children are very excited by this and are working with their teachers to create their special reward chart. Any feedback from what you have seen so far would be much appreciated.

As of next week there have been changes around the testing for COVID. Thankfully, due to the diligence of parents testing their children before the return to school on Wednesday, although there were confirmed cases, the children have not been into school and therefore have not had close contact with others. Thank you for supporting us with that. If you are able, can I please ask you to test your children twice weekly to ensure that any asymptomatic children are identified.

The new guidance from the government is as follows: *Confirmatory PCR tests following a positive lateral flow device (LFD) test result are to be temporarily suspended from Tuesday 11 January. This will mean that anyone who receives a positive LFD test result will be required to self-isolate immediately and will not be required to take a confirmatory PCR test.*

To help us to keep everyone as safe as possible and stop the spread of COVID, it is imperative that if your child is unwell, and displaying symptoms of COVID, they stay at home and take an LFD test. We will keep you updated with the ever changing nature of this.

Reception will be starting their new topic of dinosaurs. They will be learning about different types of dinosaurs, what dinosaurs were and who Mary Anning was.

Year 1 will be looking at a new story called Beegu. It is about a lost alien. We will be thinking about his feelings. In maths we will be looking at place value and using what we already know with bigger numbers. We will be jumping in gymnastics, reviewing our work on materials and learning the names of the 7 continents and 5 oceans with some very catchy tunes.

Year 2 will see the opening of the class Victorian Museum which will unveil some fascinating historic artefacts to inspire their writing and learning.

Year 3 will be rambling into the rainforest topic starting with a senses journey and finishing with some art to create a collage display of the layers of the rainforest.
