English –

Today will be the spelling and handwriting, as the spelling will take you a little longer than usual. There isn't a separate English lesson.

Spelling and handwriting:

The words this week are words are from unit 7 words with the c sound spelt ch.

For example: scheme. chorus, echo etc. The ch in these words sounds like a hard C as in cat, cough, cabbage etc.

- The speed sounds chart in the front of the small spelling log will help with the spelling of the different sounds. This week, I have included the answers at the end of the newsletter rather than waiting until tomorrow as I thought this would be more helpful.
- Sometimes the c sound in spelt ch. It can come at the beginning, middle or end of a word.
- If you can, try watching the Spelling PowerPoint I have attached.
- Say these words out aloud to somebody at home. Where is the 'c' sound which is spelt 'ch'? Discuss what the words mean.
