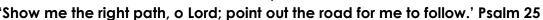




Bishop Cornish CEVA Primary School Newsletter

PE UPDATE FROM MR BROWN Family Fitness Challenge

Following the success of the Couchto5k last summer I thought it would be a good idea to introduce a family physical challenge each half term. This half term it will be to challenge yourselves and each other to see how long you can hold the Plank position for. The Plank is a great way of strengthening your core. At the end of the half term we will record everyone's best time and see who are the best Plank families and individuals! More details to follow.

Hockey Heroes

Hockey Heroes is a fun and welcoming programme aimed at children aged 5-8 that aims to develop both their physical and character 'superpowers', unlocking the hero inside them!

Caradon Hockey Club have been chosen by England Hockey as one of only two clubs in Cornwall to take on this 6-week project running from 1st October to 5th November, 5pm-6pm at Menheniot's MUGA pitch. The sessions focus on helping children develop some physical hockey superpowers such as dribbling, passing and goal scoring, but also places as much emphasis on character development superpowers including teamwork, communication, perseverance and respect.

The aim is for children to have lots of fun, experience lots of success, and feel like a hero! This will boost their confidence and ensure a positive experience of physical activity and sport that will have a beneficial effect in the rest of their life.

For £32, the child gets 6 weekly sessions every Tuesday, two hockey sticks, a ball, stickers and a personalised t-shirt.

During the week leading up to the Service we will invite the children to bring any of the above items into school.
