Year 6 have had a very artistic week. They have been busy planning for Mothering Sunday and perfecting their Chinese art. They have also produced some amazing sketches of Muslim mosques using shading and perspective. They have thoroughly enjoyed dressing up as their favourite book characters and getting involved in all the World Book Day activities. I hope they enjoy the 'new' books they took home after exchanging theirs in our book swap In our wild woods session this week, Year 4 were given the challenge to work in a group to produce a potato person. This was part of our PSHE session and the children needed to work effectively as a group, listen to everyone's ideas and work as a team to produce this. As part of our world book day, children have used 'Scratch' to make background and 'sprite' of their favourite book and character. We had such a fun book day together and it was lovely to have lots of adults join us for reading.

This week Year 2 have been practising putting the right punctuation in a sentence. They have been continuing to work with money and have been giving change from $\pounds 1$. In DT we explored levers and the children had a go at making a lever themselves. We found out about Chanukkah in RE and went for a walk in science to find out what materials things were made of.

This week Reception class learnt about the life cycle of a butterfly and read the story of the hungry caterpillar, they also created their own butterflies. They also learnt names of different baby animals and got to look at some very cute photos!

This week Year 3 had a fun filled week of Rainforest Roaming and World Book Day, along with some R.E. in the woods which had us thinking about what it is like to follow God. This week Year 1 have used oil pastels to create drawings of Van Gogh's famous sunflowers artwork as well as learning about healthy foods and the 'eat well' plate. They also enjoyed celebrating World Book Day listening to lots of stories and poems as well as talking about their favourite books and characters.

It was a wonderful World Book Day in Year 5 on Thursday, the children had such fun throughout the day with lots of exciting activities. Thank you to everyone that came in to read with the children and being involved with all of our celebrations.
