Good morning! Bonjour! Gutten Tag! ¡Buenos días!

Let's slide in to the middle of the week with a big smile... here it comes...go on! There, that's better!



Ok! Hope you haven't stopped doing your Jo Wicks PJ-PE! Got to keep those muscles and joints moving!!

Yesterday, I gave you some maths work looking at area and volume, which was quite challenging! You can keep going and having a look at this today. If you were having a panic, and felt like you had forgotten everything you'd ever learnt about area (*I'm being dramatic! I didn't show these yesterday as I wanted you to think and to work those brain-muscles!...even though brains aren't, and don't have any muscles! It's good to try and develop that mathematical stamina!

Yesterday I said we would do some R.E. and Art... so, I'll start with some R.E.

Read the Gospel reading for the Sunday just gone (below). It's one of the most famous Gospels, written by John, one of Jesus' disciples and dear friends:

John 14:1-14

"Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God; trust also in me. In my Father's house are many rooms; if it were not so, I would have told you. I am going there to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am. You know the way to the place where I am going." Thomas said to him, "Lord, we don't know where you are going, so how can we know the way?" Jesus answered, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No-one comes to the Father except through me. If you really knew me, you would know my Father as well. From now on, you do know him and have seen him." Philip said, "Lord, show us the Father and that will be enough for us." Jesus answered:

"Don't you know me, Philip, even after I have been among you such a long time? Anyone who has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father?' Don't you believe that I am in the Father, and that the Father is in me? The words I say to you

are not just my own. Rather, it is the Father, living in me, who is doing his work. Believe me when I say that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; or at least believe on the evidence of the miracles themselves. I tell you the truth, anyone who has faith in me will do what I have been doing. He will do even greater things than these, because I am going to the Father. And I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Son may bring glory to the Father. You may ask me for anything in my name, and I will do it."

*For each question below, I'd like you to write your answer as a paragraph, adding each new answer to form a larger text that explores and discusses this reading (so no need to write the number next to your answer. Just build up the text, paragraph by paragraph).

- 1. What did Jesus mean when he said, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No-one comes to the Father except through me..."?
- 2. What did Jesus promise?
- 3. How do you think the disciples felt after hearing Jesus' words? Did they understand or were they confused? It was a radical and literally, 'out of this world' kind of statement!
- 4. How do you think Jesus felt with the disciples responses? Was he patient/annoyed...etc?
- 5. How does Jesus explain His connection to God the Father?
- 6. What do you think about this? Are you as confused as the disciples were? Or are you reassured by Jesus' words and feel confident that He has prepared a 'room' for you? Or anything else?
- 7. Jesus ended this passage with "You may ask me for anything in my name, and I will do it..."? What do you

think Jesus meant? So, if I asked Jesus in prayer, for a Ferrari... I'd get one; delivered to my door with a gift tag from Jesus?? Doesn't seem right some how!

- 8. Why is Jesus saying all of this to His disciples? Is he preparing them for anything?
- 9. Finish with a conclusion summing up the overall message that Jesus was trying to get across to His disciples, followed by your thoughts or what you believe.

*If you would like, create an artistic response to this reading, which represents it in anyway you like. *I have one in mind that I would do! Perhaps I'll share it with you next week!*

*In **art**, before we get practical, I'd like you to some exploring and researching first! Using cooks or the internet, research, explore and discover artists that produced work during WWII... I say 'produced work,' as most of us think, when we say 'artist,' that we mean someone who 'paints.' However, don't forget other forms of art like: sculpture, embroidery, printing, carving, charcoal/chalk drawings... etc. During the war, our great and courageous prime minister himself, was a talented artist... *look up some of his work!*

*Create a Word document or something similar *(if you can!)* listing any famous artists, local or national, who created artworks during this time, with an example or two of their work.

*Which artwork is your favourite? Find out a little more about the artist: when and where they were born; when they started creating art; what influenced them; where they learnt...etc

Okey dokey! Don't forget, if there are some things you find tricky or cannot do, for whatever reason, *don't panic! Do your best!* Times are strange at the moment and situations change. Do what you can, and, as I've said before, if you get inspired by something else along the way, that's ok. As long as you are using your mind, learning new things, challenging yourself and practising essential skills like reading, writing and mathematics, all be well. As Jesus said above, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God; trust also in me."



The challenge of the day: Think of <u>10 reasons</u> why you are so amazing and so important! *Don't be shy now!* :-)
