
I will certainly be missing you all today.

The farmer has 3 fields. In each field, he puts 6 sheep. How many sheep does he have altogether?



Lucy has 5 friends and 20 sweets. If Lucy shared out the sweets equally, how many sweets would each of her friends get?

20 ÷ 5 =

There are 24 marbles and 6 people. How many marbles does each person have?

You could challenge yourselfto make up some word problems for each other to do.

Have a go at the Fill the Jars multiplication assignment on Mathletics.

Read a book together with an adult. Retell the story with as much detail and expression as you can.
