Children will be given their own log in so that they can upload work etc, and should not be using parent logins. We really hope that parents will feel better informed about all of the great things that happen in school, enabling us to work closely together.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank all the staff at Bishop Cornish, both in the main school and the Education centre, for their hard work at what has been, to say the least, a tricky term and wish them a relaxing well-deserved break.
