Year 6 have been busy practising for the Harvest Festival and reflecting on what we have and how we can give to those in need. We have been thinking about Wonderful World' and the people or things which make us happy. They have produced some outstanding sketches of fruits and vegetables which will form part of our harvest display.

Reception class loved using apples from the woods to make an apple crumble last week. They also enjoyed swapping with Year 6 for our first reading buddies session. They have also been busy in their maths group and doing art, practising swirls.

This week, Year 4 have been busy continuing their unicorn English work. We have been interviewing and filming unicorn experts in the woods. In science, Year 4 carried out experiments to show ways in which we can see sound. This week Year 2 have been very busy writing some wonderful stories based on 'The Magic Bed' story. The children have been using some super language as they write and perfecting their amazing handwriting. In Maths we have continued their place value work and have been amazing with number lines. We have been practising for our harvest performance in RE. We have enjoyed exploring and learning about Wales, including making some welsh cakes on the fire.

> This week Year 1 have been planning and writing their own story based around 'The Tiger who came to tea'. They have also been using the crocodile toy in Maths to help them learn about the less than and greater than symbols. In Science they have been sorting animals into different groups and in PSHE we have been celebrating being proud of ourselves for different achievements.

This week in Year 3 we have been making woolly mammoths in order to learn how to follow instructions. We then wrote our instructions using this knowledge. Along with this we were writing a class poem for harvest next week, for which we also created a beautiful collage. In maths we have been adding using place value and number facts. Finally, in science we learned all about fossil formation and Mary Anning.

Year 5 have been using Anglo-Saxon building techniques in history and DT; started our new maths topic on addition and subtraction; have written detailed instructions about how to wattle and daub(!) and have been perfecting our Brythonic Celtic harvest song!
