This week in school.....

This week in Reception, we have been enjoying the story *The Smartest Giant in Town* by Julia Donaldson. The children loved listening to the story and talking about the kindness shown by the giant. We used this as inspiration for our own learning, designing colourful ties and crowns and thinking carefully about positive words to describe ourselves. In PE, we have been very busy preparing for our first ever Sports Day! The children have been practising different activities and learning the rules of each event. We have focused on taking turns, listening carefully and showing good sportsmanship!

Year 3 had the most fantastic time on their trip to Truro this week! There was so much to explore and learn about. At the Museum of Cornwall they were excited to discover artefacts, sound recordings, audio visuals, and hands on activities that related to all of their topic learning this year, including Stone Age tools, Bronze and Iron Age axes, an Egyptian mummy and sarcophagus, and many exhibits relating to Cornish wildlife culture and heritage. In the afternoon we visited Truro Cathedral and the children were awed at the scale of the building and the mini model of the Cathedral made out of 43,000 matchsticks in 1999. They enjoyed listening to a special summer music concert with a performance from some outstanding violinists accompanied by a string ensemble.

This week in Year 5, we have been exploring the development of a foetus in Science, learning about the different stages of growth before birth. We had a fantastic time visiting the secondary school to take part in the Rounders Festival. In Maths, we have been learning about angles in a full turn and the angles found within quadrilaterals, developing our reasoning and problem-solving skills. In English, the children have been planning and beginning to write their own magical stories, inspired by our shared text, *The Fantastic Flying Books of Mr Morris Lessmore*.

This week Year 1 have been writing their own versions of *The Storm Whale*. They have been continuing work around numbers to 100 and they have been making their sea creatures with moving parts along with lots of preparation for sports day. In R.E we thought about what was unique and special about us and what talents we might have.

This week Year 2 have been continuing to write about Cheetahs and have been using all of their knowledge to write some amazing sentences. In maths they have been problem solving and have shown that they can apply their skills really well. They have learnt more about Rosa Parks in history and have been exploring her childhood. In geography they learnt about the life of a child in Kenya and how there are similarities and differences with our lives. We also wanted to share how amazing our sleepover was to the aquarium and how amazing the children were.

Year 4 have enjoyed a super trip to the Maritime Museum in Cornwall this week. We took part in A Viking workshop, learning all about trade - it was fascinating that the value could be in terms of the skill and time needed to make something, not just in the value of the product. The surf display was amazing - especially seeing the longest surfboard in the world. Year 4 also enjoyed exploring the RNLI area - we even tested out the life raft and if needed, we could get the whole class in it - funny that the teachers were left out though!! An amazing day was had by everyone.

Last Friday saw the culmination of weeks of hard work by the Year 6 Young Entrepreneurs when their products and business ideas went on sale to all children across the school and their families. The buzz around the event was brilliant all day, with everyone eagerly taking part in splatting others (Mr Matthews especially) with sponges, playing with Lego, buying beautiful craft gifts, all whilst eating lots of cake, ice cream and candy floss. Well done to the whole of Year 6 who raised over £830 for cancer research - an outstanding achievement for which they should be extremely proud, and thank you to all those who helped them at every stage. Monday and Tuesday have seen the rehearsals for *Moana* really kick into gear and on Tuesday both Years 5 and 6 took part in a rounders competition at the secondary school. Everyone had a great time and was impeccably behaved. Fantastic ambassadors for the school as usual.
