Good morning everyone. Well, I wonder did you guess which was my most and least favourite mini-beast and why.

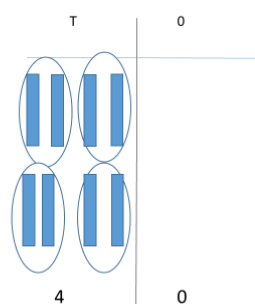
My most favourite is a ladybird because I like the colour and think they are beautiful when they fly. I used to search for them all the time when I was your age.

RE - Judaism. Theme: The Covenant.

Key Question – How special is the relationship that Jews have with God?

Think about a time when you made a promise – was it easy to keep it?
Today's learning is about the special relationship or Covenant (promise) between God and the Jewish people.

The Covenant started in the book of Genesis when God promised to give Abraham and his wife Sarah children – even though they were very old! They were to do as God asked and he would protect them and give them the land of Israel.

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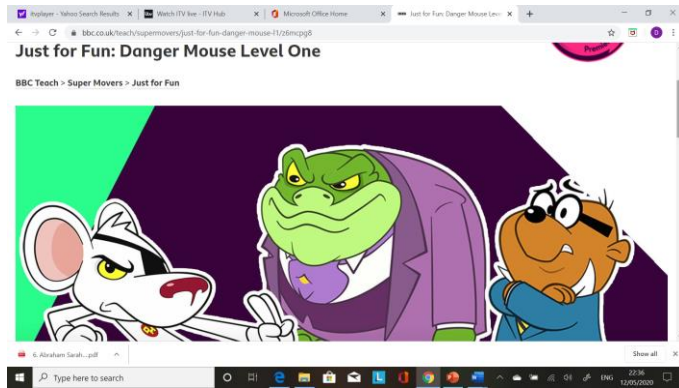
