This week in school we have...

Year 6 have been learning about their social hierarchy in the Shang Dynasty, exploring the power system and how workers were exploited. We reflected about social hierarchy today and had some really in-depth conversations about whether they believe such a thing still exists in Britain today. They have also written some exceptional sentences for English connected to the Firework Maker's Daughter. They used onomatopoeia and metaphors to create imagery.

This week in Year 3 we learnt about the location of the world's rainforests and we made clay South America continents. We also continued working as teams in PSHE where we are designing community gardens with a budget in mind. We also continued our Earthshattering events English unit and Multiplication work. This week Year 2 have gone shape crazy!! They have shown how clever they are at naming shapes and then used their knowledge of sides and vertices to draw and make them. In literacy they have been writing superstars and are getting close to their own independent write. They found out all about exercise in science and asked questions about which exercise would make their hearts beat fastest – testing this out was the best part! We spent time creating William Morris wallpaper using printing and on finding out the differences between a Victorian kitchen and a kitchen now. We acted some important Jewish stories in the woods and thought about what this told us about what Jewish people think God is like. It has been a very busy week!

> Reception class this week followed the wizard's instructions and their egg has started to hatch! There has been great excitement every day coming in and observing any changes. They have also been busy learning about repeating patterns in math and practised their phonics on a frosty morning.

This week Year 1 have been learning through drama and role play in literacy, imagining they are interviewing an alien, one of the key characters in our class story. They have also been joining in with thoughtful discussions about where God is in the world. This week in our learning, Year 4 have had a fun-filled week. We ventured outside in the woods for our maths lesson on Monday and created times tables pathways to help us to learn these. We started Tuesday in the beauty of our frozen world – we grabbed our wellies and all went outside to walk across the frosted field to celebrate God's wonderful world...then had hot chocolate ontside afterwards. We have been continuing with using fabulous metaphors in our English writing. Thursday saw Year 4 become artists 'painting on the ceiling' just like Michelangelo would have done in the Sistine Chapel.

It has been another busy week in Year 5. We have finished writing about the book Rose Blanche in English and will start planning our own stories linked to this next week. In history they explored the difference rationing had on children's food in WW2, comparing it to their diet. This week in science they have explored Galileo Galilei and the affect air resistance has on objects (our photo this week shows the children testing different materials). In Maths, Year 5 finished their unit on fractions and started their next unit on multiplication and division in the woods.
