

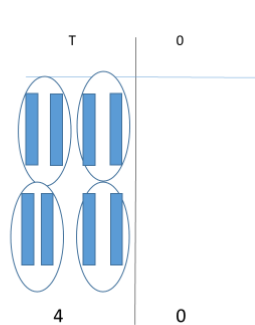

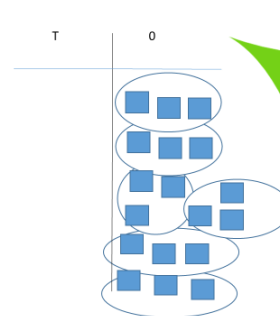
Remember - grouping can be a more efficient way to solve division and sometimes you might need to exchange.

$$80 \div 2 =$$

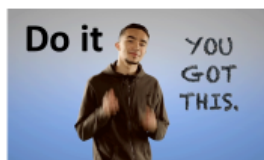
How many groups of 2 have you got?

Use this link to watch a video and then follow the instructions in order to make African animal corner bookmarks.

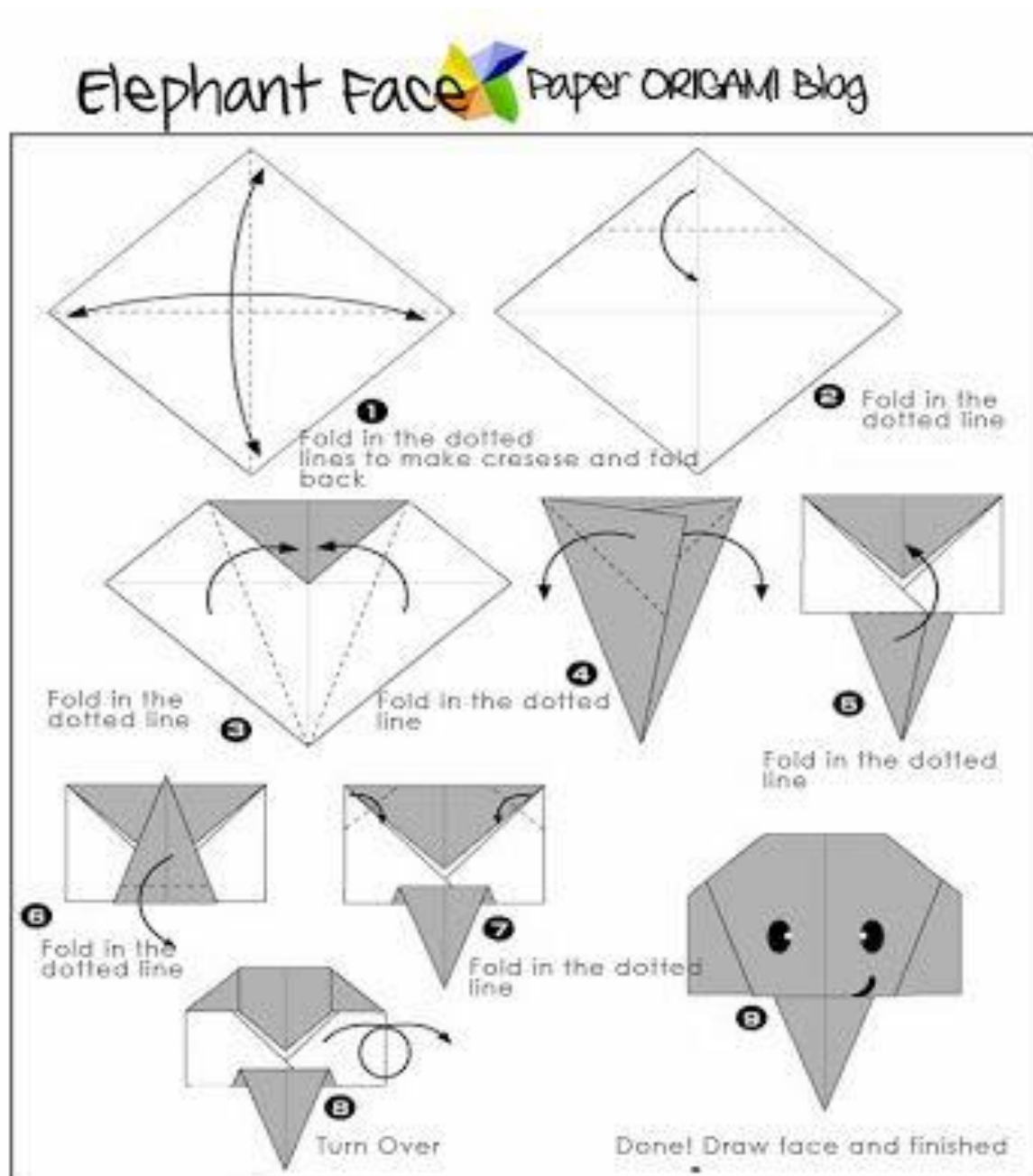
You could turn your corner bookmark into any animal you like.

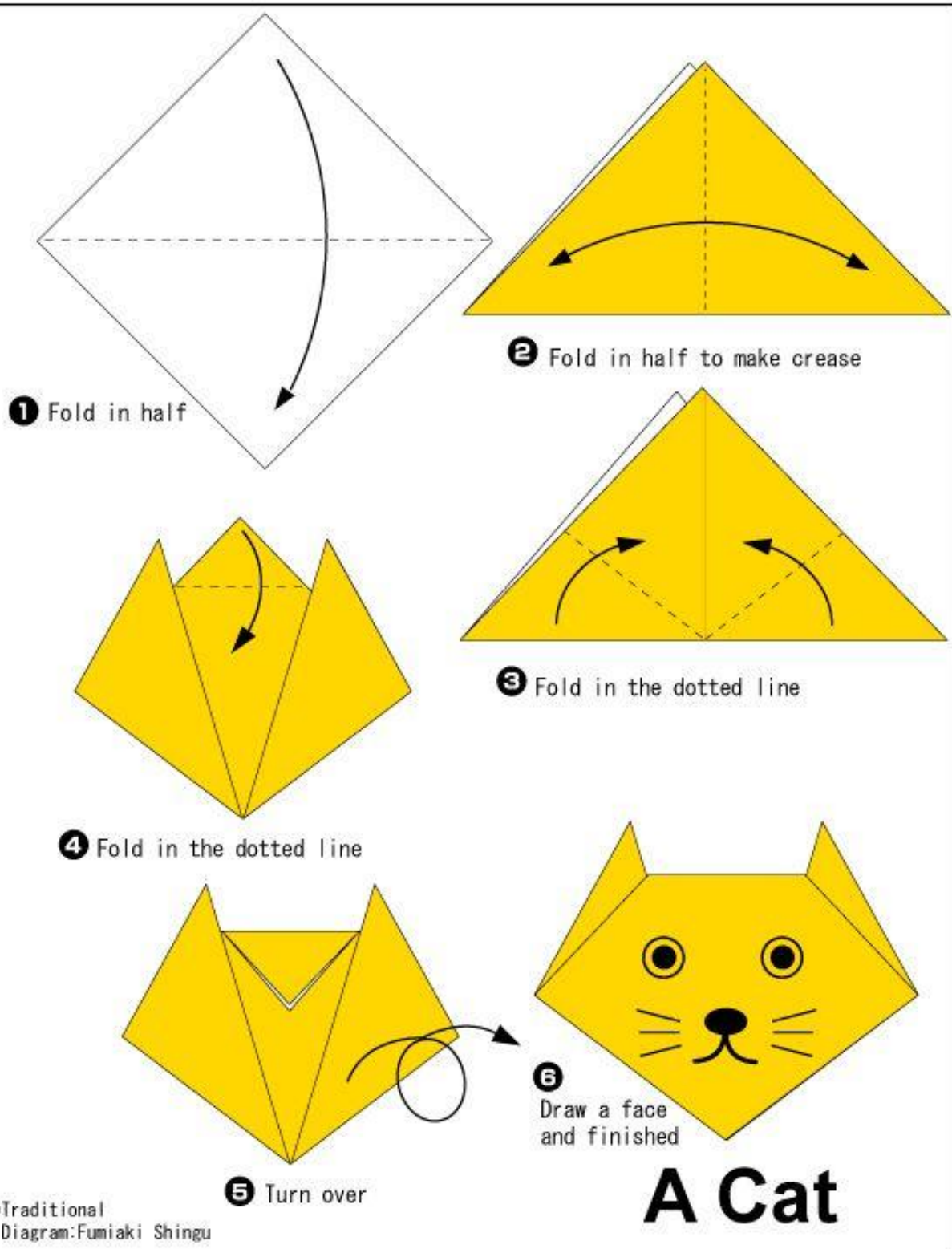

Make a spelling homophone fortune teller using the downloaded sheet and learn your spellings.

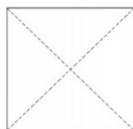

Fortune Teller

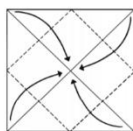

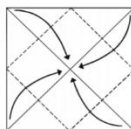


With pictures face down, fold on both diagonal lines. Unfold.

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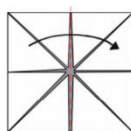
