This week in Reception, we have continued our 'Me, Myself and I' topic by learning about our families and exploring our five senses. We even enjoyed a tasty treat or two! We have also started our phonics and maths learning, which the children have really enjoyed. It has been a lovely week of learning, exploring and settling into our routines.

This week in year 3 we have been starting to explore our history topic of the Stone Age by learning about how and why farming changed their lives and using inference when looking at images and artifacts. We have also really enjoyed learning about rocks and some of us even found some examples of extrusive igneous rocks in the woods! It was exciting to handle real life examples of volcanic rocks and notice how light they were.



Year 5 have been putting into practice different vocabulary choices in order to write a non-fictional timeline about Ancient Greece. This has dovetailed nicely with their historical studies on the Ancient Greeks, where last week, we looked at an overview of who they were and what made up their civilisation. Meanwhile in Science and Geography the children have been learning about the planets, space and how the sun affects the temperatures and climate on the earth.
