This week in school we have...

This week Year 3 have been continuing with place value by comparing and ordering three digit numbers. We have started to research the Stone-age in order to write our own Stone-age stories. We also foraged in the woods for pine cones and other natural materials to sketch. We then built shelters and had time to explore. Additionally, in science we learned different types of rock and grouped them into man-made and natural.

Year 4 have had a super week. We have begun our RE unit of work and have been looking at God's Wonderful World. We began this topic in our woods session looking at nature with the 'wow' factor and then creating nature collages. In our PHSE session 'becoming a class team', we have really thought about what the word 'included' means and how we can ensure our class is in inclusive.

This week Year 1 have been enjoying the story, 'Dear Zoo' and using lots of adjectives to describe the different animals. They have also been sorting and ordering objects in Maths and practising their place value skills.

Year 6 have been celebrating the life of Queen Elizabeth II. They have used sketching skills to draw her coronation and embellished them with a light dusting of water colour. They have also been getting to grips with 6 digit numbers, they have really impressed me as they have been building on their knowledge and skills which they gained last year. They are an outstanding Year 6! Well done. This week Reception class have been learning all about real life superheroes and people who help us. There has been lots of dressing up and catching bad guys in the classroom. They have also all been busy practising their phonics skills in and out of the classroom.

Year 2 have loved using their new grown up spelling books this week. They have tried so hard with all of the activities. They have also been amazing readers. In maths they have worked hard on their place value work and in science have learnt all about MRS GREN ask them to tell you!! We have learnt about the four countries in the United Kingdom and begun to talk about the good news that we find in the bible. A great week Year 2!!

Year 5 have been deepening their understanding of place value to numbers up to 10,000; learning more about proof-reading and editing, working in partners; have been thinking about the characteristics of different animal groups, looking similarities and differences; as well as re-enacting the rise of the Anglo-Saxons and the departure of the Romans on the field!
