RE People of God	Continue our learning about Moses and how he gave freedom to the Israelites. Think about the eight events in Moses' life by looking at event number 5), the ten plagues. Put yourselves in the positions of Moses and Pharaoh after the eighth plague (locusts) and create a 'conscience alley' for each of these men. • Moses' conscience alley: Write an argument for each side, one side give reasons for Moses to continue following God's will and attempting to get the slaves released; the other side state reasons why Moses should give up. • Pharaoh's conscience alley: on one side give reasons why Pharaoh should keep the Hebrews as slaves, the other side give reasons why Pharaoh should grant their freedom.
Science Forces	Make a paper helicopter to investigate the effects of air resistance and gravity. A helicopter hovers in the air as its propellers rotate. Use the template and follow the instructions to make your own helicopter. Draw your experiment and write about your findings. Think about the forces of air resistance and gravity.
