## This week in school we have...

This week in Year 4 we had some fun tasting chocolate! We tried describing three different bars, focussing on look, smell and texture, before having a taste! We came up with a wide bank of words that we can use to help us better describe 'Wonka's' chocolate during our Big Write!

This week Year 2 have been embracing the sunshine and have loved taking more learning outside. They have learnt about micro habitats in science and thought about where minibeasts like to live. In literacy we have enjoyed finishing our story and in maths we have been working hard on fractions. They children were also very enthused about learning about Nelson Mandela and showed real maturity in their discussions.

This week in Reception Class we have been learning to double numbers and explore what doubling means. We have also story mapped Stickman and his journey using our phonics to caption each picture. This week Year 1 have been sketching Van Gough's sunflower painting. They have learned about identifying wild and garden plants and making observational drawings in the woods. We have started our multiplication and division unit by counting in 2, 5 and 10, along with starting to plot out our own version of Grandad's Island.

This week Year 3 have added some well known landmarks to their class seascape and have explored effects with mixed media including collage and paint in Art. In RE this week they have learned how Muslims pray and explored what it is like in a Mosque.

This week Year 5 have been looking at the different books which make up the Bible, learning how to find a Bible reference and enjoying finding out about the story of Moses. In our topic lessons we have been travelling back to the past looking at crime and through the ages.

Year 6 have been absolutely fantastic this week preparing for SATs. I could not ask more of them as they have been so motivated and driven to do well. I know they will do next week, they are all shining stars. We have tried to have some down time as well and enjoyed the summer sunshine as you will see from the photo.
