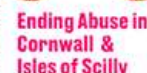

This week in school and at home

This week the Reception class children have been sharing 'The Highway Rat' and pretending to be the characters in the story. They have also learnt about using coins and playing shops.

This week Year 1 have been reading a new story called Sally and the limpet. They have begun to devise their own versions of the story with different sea creatures. They are looking forward to writing their stories next week. In maths we have been looking at place value to 100. We had lots of objects and had to group them into tens to count them - it was a lot easier than counting each one! We have also been thinking about the seasons and the longest day, learning about the 99 names for Allah and sorting different types of transport into then and now.

Year 2 enjoyed reading the African tale, 'The Spider Weaver' this week, telling the legend of how Kente cloth was created. They did some super writing, retelling the story and then some creative spider web pattern designs.

This week we have been learning to tell the time to the minute and using 24hr clock, writing our stories about Mousehole. Designing our shadow puppets and learning about light and dark.

This week Year 4 have been writing their autobiographies and in Maths, they have been learning about telling the time. In History the children have been making their fantastic Roman shields.

This week Year 5 have been using their mathematical knowledge of geometry to produce some colourful Islamic art. We have also written a recount of our days in Heatree ready for their assembly.

Year 6 have been delving deeper into evolution and inheritance this week, focussing on adaptive traits in our school animals, and investigating whether these traits are more suited to their natural habitats, or their domesticated ones!
