Next week in school and at home			

Reception will be learning about Holi as we continue thinking about celebrations and cultures around the world. We will be creating bright and colourful art as well as painting each other's faces!

Year 1 will be creating alien drinks and laying out our trap for Beegu. We will leave an Ipad in the window overnight to see if we can capture any evidence! In maths we will be working on our subtraction skills and using number lines as well as ten frames to help us. We will be learning about Tim Peake, using the big apparatus, having a go at papier-mache and thinking about creating an aerial view of our school with construction.

Year 2 will be creating some interesting music with a junk band using different types of materials. In Science they will also be learning about some famous scientists and inventors who discovered materials that we use in our everyday lives. In English they will be learning about school life for Victorian children....very different to the Bishop Cornish experience!

Year 3 will enjoy our well-deserved movie afternoon.

Year 4 will be finishing our geography unit about Europe and will be learning how to tell the time in Spanish.

Year 5 will travel through black holes into new galaxies as they write their sci-fi stories. They have been researching the solar system and been thinking about inventing a new planet for their stories.

Year 6 will be thinking about 'What kind of king is Jesus?' in R.E.; continue to improve their writing by further text deconstruction; finish our maths work on percentages; making Morse code bracelets and try out some air-raid art, inspired by Henry Moore, using charcoal!

This week in school and at home

This week Year 1 have been busy writing and following instructions to make things for Beegu. We made jam sandwiches and hula hoop shaped biscuits. In maths we have been working really hard on our number bonds to 10 and 20. We have loved creating Matisse inspired pictures on the chromebooks and learning about the first moon landing.

This week Year 4 have continued their fascinating journey around Europe and have been looking at how to stay safe online.

In Year 3 this week we have been colour mixing to learn the Spanish colours and writing a humorous poem about a creature eating our teacher! Year 5 have been travel agents and desk top publishers, researching and designing their travel brochures using software to attract tourists to North America. They have continued to get to grips with fractions and been reflecting on how Christian Charities help and support those in need.

This week Reception class have been learning about different seasons. We spoke about each season and went looking for any signs of spring around the school. We spotted buds on trees and some flowers growing. We will check regularly for any more signs!

This week Year 2 have been learning about the importance of recycling and enjoying the story of Duffy the turtle. They have been learning more about Victorian life and taking inspiration from Renoir's umbrella painting for their creative writing.

Year 6 have been stepping into the shoes of real evacuees from WWII, learning about their experiences; listening to their interviews and reading their letters home. This has inspired them to think carefully before writing their own letter as an evacuee. We have also been learning more about percentages, finding percentages of numbers and solving problems. We've also started to explore the vital roles women played during the war effort, linking beautifully into 'International Day of Women and Girls in Science 2022!'
