<u>Monday</u>

Today we would like you to listen to Mrs Nile reading the story of The Mousehole Mice (there are 2 parts).

Listen carefully and then answer the guided reading questions.

<u>Tuesday</u>

For the rest of this week, we are going to think about persuasive writing.

You are a member of the St Ives Tourist Board and your job is to design and make a poster/ leaflet to persuade people to come to St Ives for a holiday!

Let's find out how to persuade your reader to visit St Ives!

First of all log onto Twinkl Go, type in the code: TK5864 and watch the powerpoint: 'Writing to persuade presentation'.

Did you manage to spot any of the 4 features of persuasive writing?

Have a look at the word mat. It gives you great examples of persuasive writing – how to begin your sentences and which words to use. Print this sheet out, if you can, it will be very useful. Now try the WAGOLL sheet. You'll need to highlight or underline the 4 different features – ask a family member to help.

<u>Wednesday</u>

Today we will find out about more features of persuasive writing that will help us when we design our leaflet or poster.

Look at the poster for today and read through all the features. Now watch these adverts:

They are all quite different but they are all trying to persuade us to buy something. Can you spot any of the features from yesterday or today? You'll need to watch the adverts again – choose 2 and then fill in the 'Features of Adverts recording sheet'. You can do 4 adverts if you have time!

<u>Thursday-</u>

Today we are going to look at written adverts.

These have fantastic written language, use lots of images, have catchy titles and brief content. Did you notice that some TV adverts last over a minute, while lots of written adverts can be read in less than 20 seconds! Each word must work hard to persuade!

Look at the adverts for the trainers.

Can you spot the persuasive features?

Fill in today's recording sheet. Choose 2,3 or 4 adverts.

<u>Friday –</u>

Today you are going to design your poster/leaflet for the St Ives Tourist board. Watch the video about St.Ives again that we looked at last week. https://www.youtube.com/watch?app=desktop&v=dksyH4JmfKE

While you are watching think about these questions:

Who are you trying to persuade to visit?

What can people do when they visit St Ives?

What makes it a special place?

Where can people stay in St Ives?

Now design and make your poster or leaflet.

Plan carefully – think about all the features of persuasive writing (check with the word mat and poster). Describe it using wow verbs, adverbs and adjectives. What about using similes – 'like a jewel?'

What size paper will you use? A4? A3? (if it's a poster). Will you fold it, if it's a leaflet? Think about colour too and your writing. Will you use capital letters? Bubble writing? Will you add illustrations or print out some images?

You'll need your poster or leaflet to catch peoples' eye – make it stand out!
