This week in Year 4 we looked at Norse gods in Art. We first tried drawing different Nordic symbols like Jormungadr or Odin's Spear Gungnir. From here we talked about how we could create our own god, choosing their name and what they are the god of. We then used this information to create our own symbol.

This week Year 2 have been working hard on their Owl stories. In maths they have been exploring fractions and measuring. They did some super sorting in science and were able to talk about things that are dead, alive and never alive. This week in Reception Class we have been writing book reviews of our book 'Zog', creating golden stars and retelling the story. We have also been learning to count down from 10 and take away small numbers, working on our letter foundation and sounding out words we want to write. They have been finishing work around the numbers to 50 and learning about Hanukah in RE.

This week Year 3 have been learning some Cornish songs and words from the Cornish language as part of our Year 3 topic about our beautiful region. They have also been discovering facts about the Islamic regions as part of RE and learning vocabulary for the weather and seasons in Spanish.

This week Year 5 have been completing their science unit 'Living things in habitats'. The plants we had taken cuttings from were ready to be planted... let's see if they grow well. The children have also been enjoying learning and practising skills in tennis and have been lucky to play outside in the lovely sunshine.

Year 6 are now busy preparing for their SATs. We are working through any topics which they feel they need more practice, so all our lessons for the next couple of weeks will be areas which they feel they would like to revisit. They are working very hard and I am very proud of their resilience and work ethic as they approach SATs. In RE, they have been linking the Gospels to how Jesus would want us to live and how society and social media can impact on this. In PE, they are learning the skills for rounders and cricket and I hear from Mr Brown they that they are excelling in these.
