This week in school we have...

Reception Class have had a busy week with a few special visitors helping us learn all about people in our communities that help us. We had a visit from the RNLI who spoke to us all about water safety and how they help people. Cornwall Air Ambulance also visited and showed us their roles, we got to dress up and have lots of fun. We have also been learning how to blend the phonics sounds together and start to read some words.

Year 5 went on a treasure hunt in the woods, finding a range of clues which could be used as evidence to prove that there may be elements of truth in the story of Theseus and the Minotaur. We had such fun looking at the sources available. In our RE this week, we have been thinking carefully about what the Bible tells Christians about God, using what we have found to create pieces of artwork. It is lovely to see many home-made chilli challenges coming to school...cake is proving popular!

> This week Year 3 have been finding out about Ice Age beasts and using different grades of pencils to create drawings of them. They have also been learning about looking after our world in RE and thinking about pollution and recycling.

This week In Year 1 we have been thinking about why Grace Darling was pictured on her own in some of the artwork from the past. We have been creating pictures of the 7 days of creation, using the 'more than' and 'less than' symbols and much more. Year 6 are demonstrating superb role model qualities already! They are working hard and showcasing independent learning skills; they should be really proud of themselves. In maths, we have started work on integers and 4 operations of +, -, / and x. They are loving the WWII English book and are producing great sentences using metaphors and similes ready for writing their own story set in war time. In RE, they have been reflecting about which qualities make a good friend and which qualities show God that we love him too. In science, we have stated our theme of Electricity. They are learning about volts and circuits and will be building their own as part of planning their own investigation. Keep up the good work Year 6.

> In Year 4 this week we continued to develop our cricketing skills, focussing on bowling. The children have been working hard on perfecting their techniques, aiming for accuracy and power. In Science, we've been exploring different materials and their boiling points. The class had a great time discovering how various substances change state when heated. Our investigation into the Romans continued, as we dug deeper into the reasons why the Romans decided to invade Britain. In RE, we've been learning about the important role that vicars play in the Christian faith. We explored their responsibilities, from leading worship to supporting their communities.

This week in Year 2 we have continued to write about the different shops in our story. This week we focussed on antiques and what we might find in an antique shop. In maths we revisited our learning so far and then moved on to being masters with a number line. We explored what materials were used for in science and enjoyed finding out more about the events of the Great Fire in history. In art we looked at pictures of London landmarks and then used charcoal and chalk to create them.





Thank you to all those who have expressed an interest in the Bishop Cornish PTA.
