LATE FOR SCHOOL

Unfortunately, despite several reminders in newsletters, the number of children arriving late for school has continued to rise and this is now a cause for concern. So far this term we have recorded 267 occasions when children arrived late for school. When this occurs it has an impact on everyone.

Lessons start at 9.00am when registration closes and, if children are arriving at this time, or later, it delays the start of a lesson or interrupts all the other children's learning.

Registration opens at 8.50am and we expect children to arrive at this time. Not only is it distressing for a child arriving late, (imagine walking into a class when everyone has already started a lesson), it is distracting for those children who are ready for learning. Being late means a child will miss out on the vital start of the morning lesson – children cannot make up this time. We will therefore be monitoring this closely over the next few weeks and term.
