Medicine is important for when we are feeling poorly but needs to be used safely. Here are some of the rules we will be discussing in class about how to keep safe; -Children must never take medicine on their own as this could be very dangerous and harm their bodies. They must only take medicine when a trusted adult gives it to them. They must only take the dosage it says on the bottle/packet, NOT more. They must NEVER take each other's medicine.
