This week Year 6 have been revisiting percentages, decimals and fractions and researching the Islamic religion. This week Year 3 have been thinking about Easter and what it means to be Christians. We have created some beautiful art pieces and in PSHE we have met our challenges we set with great enthusiasm. Also, what superstars we were at the Easter service even with all the nerves!

This week Year 1 have been learning about the symbolism of eggs and new life and reenacted the washing of the feet in our Easter service at the church. They have also been doing some outdoor cricket and football in PE with Mr Brown, prepared some delicious Easter crispie cakes and learned about the different trees and plants in our school. Year 4 have really enjoyed our 'Spanish Day' this week in school.
