### This week in school we have...

Year 5 had an amazing Ancient Greek Day on Tuesday. We enjoyed a catwalk fashion show, finding out about Greek architecture, sketching and studying as a Greek child would trying out writing in Greek! We finished the day with a wonderful Greek feast with adults in the classrooms being slaves! A fabulous day for all. This week in Year four, we have looked at the connection between the parable of Abraham and parable of Noah. The class explored how both of these characters react to God's message, and the actions they took in return. After recapping how we can navigate a Bible, the class were excellent at extracting information from these parables, to inform their ideas on what faith is, and how Noah and Abraham showed faith in God.

This week Year 3 have been talking about the Trinity in RE, looking at artists' representations of it and creating their own. They have also been learning some more historical facts about the Stone Age and done some outdoor learning in the woods.

This week Year 2 have been working really hard on their nativity play and are very excited to show you all next week. They have also continued to work on their great fire of London writing as well as creating some amazing Great Fire art. In RE they have written their own version of Away in a Manger and continued to talk about why Christmas is important for Christians.

This week Reception class looked at shape in power maths including making their own shape robots and towers. They also had a very special visit after writing letters to Father Christmas asking for a new gonk. Some dancing reindeer came into the classroom and left us a surprise in the magic box - a brand new gonk! This week Year 1 have been subtracting in maths, rehearsing and singing their hearts out. They have been burning off some energy in the woods as well as learning about what bullying is in PSHE. They have also looked at the Christmas Story in a deeper sense.

Year 6 have been getting familiar with fractions this week (3) They have revisited equivalent fractions and how to add fractions with different denominators. They worked so hard and I am so proud of them. In English they have been examining a letter to the Max (The Grinch's dog) to see if he can save Christmas! They have looked at Year 6 writing devices to elevate their writing and then they will apply their learning in their own letters. We were also asked to help plant a Coronation tree with the Mayor and Mayoress of Saltash. Miley and Lexi did a grand job in their official roles.
