This week in school we have...

After the most amazing sleepover with the sharks, Year 2 have had another busy week. They spent time thinking about Africa and writing questions for some African children. They also completed their RE project about how to show our faith by planning and then having a café in Year 2. They decided to raise money for the foodbank and raised an amazing £79.45. The children loved being waiters and waitresses! They used all of their maths and literacy skills to create everything they needed and to count the money.

This week Year 4 have been busy getting their exhibit ready for the RCS. We have been planting out our seedlings in recycled plastic bottles to make our edible bottle garden. In our PSHE lessons we have been looking at relationships and different scenarios involving problems in friendships and how we might resolve these. The discussions the children had were excellent.

This week Year 3 have been creating a crown for the Royal Cornwall Show, continuing our work around money in Maths and making pin wheels to celebrate Pentecost. This week Year 6 have been learning about the circulatory system. They have learnt how blood is pumped around the body and how exercise affects heart rate. They have also been learning about how to be healthy for our bodies and mental health. They have started their new English book: The Journey, which looks at the plight of refugees and how important it is to have a home which is safe.

This week Year 1 have been finding out about Sir Francis Drake in history and exploring the school field using a compass. They have also been learning about what makes a good friend in PSHE and enjoying some outdoor sports games with Mr Brown.

This week Reception class discovered their classroom had been ransacked by the Highway Rat! He left a mess, threw toys everywhere and stole Bagel, our class teddy bear. The children had to write wanted posters and set traps to try and get him back. Luckily the rat apologised with a delivery of cake!

In English, Year 5 are enjoying writing the adventure story Gorilla by Anthony Brown. This week they have been including adjectives, similes and onomatopoeia in their writing. In Maths, we have finished exploring fractions, percentages and decimals and have explored creating graphs outside ready for next term. During PSHE we discussed having a healthy relationship with technology and ways to stay safe and happy online. In art, the children have explored watercolours and created self-portraits. During RE, are question to investigate was 'What do Sikhs believe about God?' Finally in Geography, they investigated trade and what the main exports are in the different countries of South America.
