# Handwriting

Today I would like you to practise the letters  $\boldsymbol{n}$  and  $\boldsymbol{m}$ .

Yes, you've guessed it, these letters are both in the robot force family, so they

start with a robot  $\Gamma$  again. Yesterday we were trying to make our n small and

our **h** tall. Well, today, both of these are small letters. The tricky part is

getting both of the humps or mountains on the  ${f M}$  the same size, and not making a huge valley between the mountains! Do you remember 'Nobby and the net' and 'Maisy, mountain mountain'? Show your parents.

(Parents, some children take longer than others to write, for a variety of reasons, so please don't worry if the writing tasks this week seem to be progressing too quickly for your child. The important thing is that they have a go and try to enjoy creating their story. If your child needs help by writing the start of some of their sentences for them, or with spelling, or anything else, then please do give them the support that they need to achieve. ### Maths - Today we are remembering how to tell o'clock and half past times.

Have a look at the BBC bitesize lesson first, about telling o'clock and half past times. <u>https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/articles/zs6tjsg</u>

On the maths sheet, see if you can draw the hands on the clock to show the times. Remember that the long hand points to number 12 every time it is an o'clock time, and it points to number 6 every time it is a half past time. If you can remember that, then you just have to think about where the little hour hand goes. The bitesize lesson explains this to you. Try to notice on a clock in your house when it is an o'clock or a half past time, and impress your family by telling them!

There is a game you can play at the bottom of the Bitesize lesson - Karate Cats Maths. Choose the 'measurement' tab and start with Bronze level.

Or if you want to have a go at digital times as well, there is a game on Topmarks maths. Parents, there is also a teaching clock on this site if you want to use it in helping your child.
