

This week in school.....

This week in Reception, we have continued our *World of Julia Donaldson* topic and explored *The Highway Rat* as our story of the week. The children thoroughly enjoyed listening to the story, which made us all feel very hungry with its many mentions of delicious treats! We decided to bake our own shortbread biscuits, carefully weighing, mixing, rolling and shaping the ingredients. However, when we came to enjoy them the next day, they had mysteriously disappeared! We realised that the Highway Rat must have taken them! To help us get our biscuits back, we created 'wanted' posters, describing the Highway Rat's appearance and character! In phonics, the children have been working hard on applying their sounds in writing, and in maths we have been exploring comparison.

This week the Year 3s have been learning about Cornish pirates as part of our topic. They have made up their own pirate and ship names and have written about life as a pirate as well as learning typical pirate phrases. In RE they have been learning about Judaism and Passover and discussed freedom. For PSHE they had fun matching animals with their offspring as part of our learning about families and relationships.

This week in Year 5, we explored why crime increased during the 1800s while death rates fell. In maths, we continued converting units, including money, grams and kilograms, and metres and millimetres. In English, we began writing our stories based on the short film *The Fantastic Flying Books of Mr. Morris Lessmore*.

This week Year 1 started their new book *The Storm Whale*. They have been looking at numbers to 100. Getting ready for sports day by doing some relays. Thinking about sea creatures in art and much more.

This week year 2 have started their secret agent training. They know that they are going on a trip with their sleeping bags but are yet to find out where!! They did brilliantly in their first clue finding mission this week. They enjoyed finding out about tigers and cheetahs in English and found some amazing facts. In RE they explored what lessons Allah tells us about looking after our world and in geography they explored the human and physical features of national parks.

This week, Year 4 have had a super start to the new term. In maths, we have been learning about angles and we really enjoyed our 'angle hunt' in the classroom spotting, acute, obtuse and right angles. We have also been working so hard on our times tables - we love rapping these to a disco beat! In science, we have been looking at how humans can help with looking after our world and we have linked this to our new English unit of work...'*The Creature*'.

Year 6 have had a busy first week back in school. They have started their Young Entrepreneur Project. The class voted to raise money for Cancer research. They have created their businesses, explored the financial pros and cons and asked for investment from the Dragons (Mrs Fletcher and Mrs Miller). The children will spend the next week getting their businesses up and running in readiness for next Friday. A list of stalls will be sent out later this week with pricing for children to choose what they would like to join in with, and an invite for all parents and their children to join us after school on Friday 12th June. We are very impressed with the many wonderful ideas the children have had!
