Reception class continued to think about the colour monster this week and spoke about their feelings and what we do when we feel lots of emotions. We drew some of our ideas to share as a group. We also enjoyed playing in our new construction area in the woods, using hammers and screwdrivers in pallets and seeing our reading buddies again!

This week Year 1 have been enjoying poetry and matching rhyming words, inspired by animals. We looked at the work of St George's Chapel in RE and found out how we can show the teachings of Jesus through our actions. We have been super busy and are looking forward to a great half
